#### **Format**

A one-week residential programme in Cambridge, UK. Members will attend a combination of thematic workshops, family case-study presentations, group discussions, guided one-to-one consultations, and networking gala dinners.

An expert-led Faculty team will guide members through the programme; as well as chairing and facilitating modules and to provide constructive challenge to inform their reflections. Members will also hear from expert contributors, sharing their expertise across a range of topics, and delving into meaningful conversations and case studies.
